

BACKGROUND- MONTANA POULTRY GROWERS


- Incorporated in 2006- organized to provide an avenue for producers to collaboratively meet their processing needs
- Statewide, open membership cooperative- 21 members
- Coop purchased 2 sets of processing equipment (scalder/plucker) for members
- Members interested in retail markets and needed inspection and increased production



MOBILE PROCESSING UNIT- 2009-2010

- Developed in collaboration with Farms for Families, Mission Mountain Food Enterprise Center and AERO
- Funding partners included; USDA RBEG, Toledo Foundation, USDA Risk Management, MT Dept. of Agriculture
- State Inspected under the 20,000 bird federal exemption
- Training program launched in 2010- held five statewide trainings

MOBILE PROCESSING UNIT ASSESSMENT-2011

- Approximately 3000 birds processed in 2011serving 4 producers
- The four members developed on-farm processing plans after undergoing training
- The unit traveled approximately 500 miles per farm @ \$3.50 per gal
- Challenges- damage occurred during travel, insurance cost to cooperative- not producer

MPU COST ASSESSMENT

× MPU Cost

+ Truck \$18,000.00

+ Trailer \$7,000.00

+ Equipment \$20,000.00

+ Custom Fabrication \$1,000.00

Variable Costs

+ Insurance \$2,000.00

+ Licensing \$100.00

+ Supplies \$200.00

+ Repairs \$3,000.00

- × Annual Overhead- \$5,300.00
- Annual Revenue- \$5,250.00- (3000 birds @Charge per bird- \$1.75)

MPU CHALLENGES

- Members are small scale production- ave 100 birdsminimum usage for MPU was 250 birds
- High feed costs- average cost per bird is \$2.30/lb
- Large distance and high cost to travel in MT
- × Damage to unit
- Regulation still a barrier
 - + Every local county sanitarian has their own rules
 - + Two agencies to comply with MT Dept of Livestock and MT Dept of Health and Human Services

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES AND DEVELOPMENTS

- Clarify Regulation- MT Dept. of Livestock will have sole jurisdiction
 - Address lack of understanding of federal exemptions at local level
- Explore 1000 bird federal exemption
- Expand small scale equipment usage- purchase 2 more sets
- Explore cooperative purchasing of feed and chicks
- Continue education opportunities for members
 - Collaboration with NCAT on educations workshops in 2013
